GUIDING PRINCIPLES OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Adoption of the guiding principles reflects the Municipality's commitment to take the Québec Sustainable Development Act into account in the management of its economic, environmental and social activities. The major guidelines will help the Municipality promote economic development, preserve the environment and ensure the well-being of the community as well as future generations.

Rawdon is committed to respecting the following guiding principles in its decision making and activities:

- Prioritize the quality of life of its citizens
- Take public consultations to heart in its decision making process.
- Provide its employees with a stimulating and quality environment

THE RCM WILL VISIT YOUR PROPERTY

Under the Act respecting municipal taxation, The Matawinie RCM has the duty of visiting properties to ensure the accuracy of the data which will be used to update the real estate assessment roll planned for January 2018. The inspections will begin shortly for a certain number of properties. Visits take place from Monday to Saturday between 8 am to 9 pm, except for holidays.

The designated inspectors will identify themselves by means of a photo identity card certified by the management of the Matawinie RCM. During this visit, they will note the physical characteristics of the building (interior and exterior materials, dimensions, etc.). The inspectors will also take pictures of the building and record its location. You will be asked to sign a property visit confirmation. Generally, a property inspection only takes a few minutes.

THE RCM WILL VISIT YOUR PROPERTY (CONT'D)

In the event of you absence, the inspectors will only leave a calling card to confirm their visit if they wish to take an appointment with you. It will be your responsibility to contact them at the designated number.

The evaluator's representatives must have free access to your property in order to establish its true value. Your cooperation is essential.

Fraud is the act of trying to appropriate the property of another through deception and dishonest trickery. Fraudsters use advanced technology, false pretenses, false identities and tempting proposi-

tions to try to convince you to divulge your personal information. They are well organized, well equipped and have many convincing methods to try to scam you.

Whether it is perpetrated by telephone, online, by mail or at your door, you can be a victim of fraud regardless of your age, level of education or income. Vigilance and research are your best weapons of protection.

COMPOST

NOTHING IS LOST, NOTHING IS CREATED, EVERYTHING IS TRANSFORMED (LAVOISIER)

Your table scraps are a precious resource. Instead of throwing them into the garbage, throw them into the brown bin and in doing so you will contribute in the making of compost that will nourish the earth.

Compost is derived of decomposed organic matter (plant or animal); garden waste (dead leaves, grass) and table scraps. This material accounts for 44% of waste generated by Quebecers (Recyc-Québec, 2009). In Rawdon, the organic matter collected from the brown bin is composted by Compo Recycle.



You can throw in anything that is edible:

- Fruits, vegetables, whole or just the peel, legumes
- Bread, cereal, flour
- Fish, seafood, poultry, meat
- Dairy products (cheese, butter)
- Frozen food
- Coffee beans, grinds, coffee filters, tea bags
- Chips, sweets, desserts
- Spices and condiments (ketchup, mayonnaise, salad dressing)
- All food waste (leftovers)



ENVIRONMENT

Compost (cont'd)

Please note that meat should be discarded in small quantities and in small pieces (i.e.: table scraps and not a whole chicken!). The composting process generates high temperatures that kill the micro-organisms found in meat.

The following items can also be discarded in your brown bin:

- Pet food and litter
- Cold ashes
- Bones, fish bones, egg shells
- Paper and cardboard soiled with food (paper towels, pizza boxes, tissue paper, paper plates, etc.)
- Garden waste (plants, dead leaves, grass)

Don't be shy and use your brown bin to its full potential. The compost made from your garden and food waste is of high quality and can be obtained at the Écocentre (450 834-5065).

A REMINDER TO EMPTY YOUR SEPTIC TANK

We would like to remind you that it is mandatory to have your septic tank emptied every two (2) years for a permanent residence and every four (4) years for a seasonal residence. In order to enforce these requirements, the Municipality adopted a bylaw asking citizens to submit a copy of their septic tank emptying receipt. When you have your septic tank emptied, remember to ask for your payment receipt and forward it to Rawdon's Department of Town Planning and Development. It's possible that your septic pumping contractor sends a copy to the Municipality. Ask them to make sure!



If you are planning on building a house, adding a room to your existing home or modifying your installation, you must obtain a certificate of authorization from the Municipality beforehand.

NUISANCE TO PRIVATE PROPERTY

Constitutes a nuisance by anyone occupying a property, to deposit, leave, throw away, place or allow to be deposited or left on such a property: ashes, trash, scrap metal, paper, piles or scatterings of wood, household waste, empty bottles, rubbish, any type of scrap, foul smelling substances, scrap vehicles or any vehicle debris or parts, dead animals, refuse, all out-of-order equipment, any harmful or unhealthy substances.

The Municipality can take action against property owners to ensure the cessation of these nuisances throughout its entire territory.

WATERCRAFT STICKERS AND PATROLS ON PONTBRIAND LAKE

Once again, the Municipality will organize preventive patrols to raise awareness among boaters on safe boating practices and to verify that they have their current sticker for navigating on Pontbriand Lake. A strong presence during the summer season will ensure greater safety for all lake users. You can obtain your sticker at Town Hall during regular office hours or at Cascades Park, on Saturdays and Sundays from 11 am to 3 pm (from May 21st to June 12th) then 7 days a week from 10 am to 8 pm (from June 18th to September 5th).

Cost of stickers:

- Waterfront property owners and Rawdon residents: \$25 for the summer season
- Visitors: \$150 a day



Naturalization of shorelines

- Raise citizens' awareness regarding naturalization of their shorelines through door-to-door visits.
- Collect and compile data on the state of the artificialization of shorelines.
- Offer citizens support throughout the naturalization process of their shoreline.

2 Drinking water conservation

- Check watering practices throughout the territory and verify that the bylaw is being respected.
- Raise awareness among citizens by informing them on the use of drinking water and about the bylaw that regulates its use.
- Ensure compliance with regards to watering bans issued by the Municipality, if need be.



Waste management - Inform people on the subject of sorting waste.
